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MANUKAU HARBOUR COMMITTEE.

Report of Manukau Harbour Committee dated 6.8.1946, re Wharf at Te Whau Point, recommending:-

- (1). That copy of the letter from the Auckland City Council be forwarded to the Blockhouse Bay Improvement Association Club (Inc.).
- (2). That the Association be advised that, in view of the reply received from the Auckland City Council, no action will be taken by the Board with regard to the erection of a Jetty at Te Whau Point until such time as the Council undertakes to provide the necessary access thereto.

MANUKAU HARBOUR COMMITTEE

TUESDAY, 2ND JULY 1946, AT 2.5 P.M.

PRESENT: - The Chairman (Mr. T.A. Bishop), Messrs. H.R. Mackenzie, L.C. Reid and J.B. Donald. Apologies for absence were received from Messrs. H. Turner, A.S. Sutherland and E.V. Sutherland.

THE MINUTES of the previous meeting of Committee dated 21st May 1946 (copy of same having been forwarded to each Member) were taken as read and were confirmed.

The following matters were considered:-

1. WHARF - TE WHAU POINT, BLOCKHOUSE BAY -RECLAMATION ETC.

Report of Superintendent and Engineer, 29.3.1946, re construction of wharf at Te Whau Foint, Blockhouse Bay, and provision of a reclamation for clubhouse and hauling-out area for boats and dinghys, stating that the feasibility of both proposals was based on the assumption that the City Council contemplated certain works involving heavy expenditure, which the City Engineer had assured him the Council had no intention of doing, and that, under the circumstances, he would adhere to the suggestion contained in the final paragraph of his report dated 15th February 1946, viz. that any commitment in regard to works at Blockhouse Bay be deferred for at least twelve months.

The Chairman moved; -

That a reply be sent that, as soon as the Auckland City Council undertakes to make Te Whau Point accessible, the Board is prepared to carry out its undertaking of December 1935, i.e. to place on the estimates the cost of a small wharf and launch landing, and that the Association be requested to obtain from the Council a definite statement as to the Council's intentions in this area.

2. PROVISION OF A PERMANENT HAULING-OUT AREA - MANUKAU HARBOUR.

Letter from Manukau Boating Association, 8.6.1946, asking the Board to give consideration to the provision of a permanent haulingup area in the Manukau on the same lines as the ramp and reclamation now under construction in the Waitemata Harbour; together with letter from W. Mayhill, 12.6.1946, asking the Board to suggest and grant permission for some facilities for the boats in "Camper's Bay" in relation to (a) storing gear; (b) moorings and (c) repairs and painting.

The Chairman moved: -

That consideration be deferred and that the applicants be asked for further details of the suggested proposals.

The Meeting terminated at 2.22 p.m.

BLOCKHOUSE BAY.

At a meeting of the Manukau Harbour Committee on 23rd July 1946 at which, inter alia, a letter from the Blockhouse Bay Improvement Association Club Inc. was under review, consideration was deferred pending advice from the City Council as to whether, and if so what, works were contemplated by the Council in the Blockhouse Bay area.

Advice has now been received from the City Council that, apart from the work already carried out, the only other work authorised by the Council is the removal of a number of trees which are considered dangerous. The Council states "it is not proposed, at this stage, to do anything further apart from planting polutukawa trees as opportunity affords and provision will be made in such planting for the eventual development of the Foint".

This statement would appear to dispose, in the meantime, of the request made by the Association which was based upon the assumption that the Council intended to carry out additional works in the vicinity of Te Whau Point.

Dear Sir,

In 1935 and 1936 correspondence was exchanged between the Board and your Council in relation to a request from the Blockhouse Bay Improvement Association for a jetty at Te Whau Point, Blockhouse Bay.

For many years past the Board has refused to construct wharves in positions where there is no provision for public access and in agreeing to place an item in its estimates for the construction of a wharf at Te Whau Point the Board made it a condition that the wharf would not be constructed unless the City Council provided reasonable access thereto at all states of the tide.

The latest official advice received from your Council on the matter appears to be a letter dated 18th June, 1936, in which it was stated that owing to the Council's financial position it had not been found possible to place an amount on the estimates for the current year to cover the cost of extending the road to Te Whau Point. At that stage and during the war years the matter appears to have been left in abeyance.

Recently the Blockhouse Bay Improvement Association and the Blockhouse Bay Yacht and Motor Boat Club have renewed their request for a wharf but in doing so they suggest that the Council is contemplating further work in the vicinity of Te Whau Point which, if proceeded with, is likely to justify - if not necessitate - re-design of the proposed wharf.

It has been suggested to the Board that the work contemplated by the Council consists of :-

- (a) Extension of the large concrete culvert recently
- constructed so as to carry the point of discharge out to or near low water mark, and
 (b) excavation of a considerable volume of spoil from the steep ridge running down to Te Whau Point which those urging improvements maintain to be in an unstable and dangerous condition.

Prosecution of either of these two projects insofar as they would affect the foreshore below high water of ordinary spring tides, would require both Harbour Board and Marine Department sanction and since no approach has been made by Council to the Board in this regard it is assumed that any works contemplated in the direction indicated are still in a preliminary stage.

Nevertheless, in order that it may be in a better position to consider the requests made to it the Board would appreciate advice from Council as to whether either or both of the two projects referred to above, are contemplated and likely to proceed and alternatively whether Council is likely to proceed with the pathway to the Point as visualised in the earlier discussions.

An early reply will be appreciated.

BI OCKHOUSE BAY.

Subsequent to my report of 15th February 1946 dealing with a request from the Blockhouse Bay Improvement Associa-tion Club I had a visit from Mr. Phillip Turner, a prominent member of the Association, who submitted further details of the proposals being advocated by his Association.

On 20th instant, at the request of the Blockhouse Bay Yacht and Motor Boat Club I visited the Bay and discussed with delegates from that Club certain additional proposals for a reclamation for club-house and hauling-out area for boats and dinghys.

The feasability of both proposals are based upon the assumption that the City Council contemplates heavy addition-al expenditure in extending a large stormwater culvert it is now constructing (at a cost of approximately £5,000) and in cutting down a large volume of spoil at Te Whau Point which the residents declare to be in a dangerously unstable condition.

If this latter work was contemplated by the City Council it would be possible for it to be done in such a manner as to provide the facilities desired by both the Association and the Yacht and Motor Boat Club, but it would involve the City Council in very heavy expense.

The City Engineer assures me his Council has no such plans in view and that he does not anticipate any extension of the works now in progress. If this is the case the con-ditions originally laid down in 1935 by the Board that it would place a sum on its estimates for the construction of a wharf provided the City Council would extend the road to Te Whau Point, has not yet been fulfilled nor is it likely to be in the near future.

Under the circumstances I would adhere to the suggestion contained in the final paragraph of my report of 15th February.

REQUEST FOR WHARF AT TE WHAU IOINT -BLOOKHOUSE BAY.

In December 1935 the Board agreed to place on its estimates for the following year the cost (at that time estimated at £320) of a small wharf and launch landing at Te Whau Toint - Blockhouse Bay, provided the City Council would extend the road round the foreshore to give pedestrian access thereto.

The City Council has from time to time deferred taking action in this direction but it is now stated by the Blockhouse Bay Improvement Association that there is a prospect of the road approach being undertaken by the Council if the Harbour Board will affirm its willingness to construct the wharf. The Association asks, however, that the wharf be constructed in stone work and concrete to conform with the present sea wall.

Even a timber wharf, at today's prices, would cost not less than double the estimate in 1935 and it is more than probable that materials therefor will not be available for a considerable time to come.

No estimate has yet been prepared for the work if done in stone and concrete but it would be substantially more costly than in timber.

With the large demands now being made on the Board's supplies of labour, materials and funds I think it would be wise to defer any commitment in regard to works at Blockhouse Bay for at least twelve months.

JETTY - BLOCKHOUSE BAY.

- Letter from Mt. Roskill Road Board, 27.9.1934. -

A suitable position for a landing is at Te Whau Point at the western end of the bay, where a jetty about 130ft. long would reach the edge of the deep water channel where an ample depth of water would be available at all states of the tide.

The cost of this jetty, with set of steps, would be approximately,.....£320/-/-.

The proposed site is not within the Mt. Roskill Road District, but in the City area.

To provide access to the landing the see wall and reclamation at present being constructed by the Auckland City Council would require to be prolonged about 240ft. to the site of the landing, and there would be no objection to this being done on the same conditions as those under which the present reclamation is being carried out.

The Board would receive no revenue from the proposed landing and has refused to provide the finance for a number of similar requests both in the Manukau and Waitemata Harbours. The wharf would be an undoubted advantage to the boating community and it would be reasonable that some contribution should be made by the City or by those interested, towards the cost of the structure if it is to be built.

- (a) A timber jetty IO' in width with handrailing each side with a tee head 40' x 20' with waiting room, landing steps and ladder, to give IO' of water at low water spring tides, would have to be 145' long from the iron peg driven into the sandstone reef and would cost about £450, using old timber wherever possible and not charging for this timber.
- (b) A jetty to give 20' of water at low water spring tides, same dimensions as above, would have to be 210' long and would cost about 2580 without allowing anything for Borrent 13/16 the old timber.
